The Common Good

paying taxes, military service, jury duty

Justice

fairness...in handing out of benefits, duties, fixing of wrongs & in decision making

Separation of Powers

the power of the government has been divided into three branches

Checks and Balances

each of the three branches has power over the other branches

Individual Rights

all people have basic rights not granted by the government, but must be protected by the government

Freedom of Religion

the right to practice (or not practice) your religious beliefs without the government interfering
